About QRIDA



The Queensland Rural and Industry Development Authority (QRIDA) has been supporting Queensland's primary producers for more than 30 years.



Statutory authority of the Queensland Government and specialist provider of government financial assistance and advisory support to rural and regional Queensland.



QRIDA administers financial assistance to disaster affected primary producers, businesses and non-profit organisations under the jointly funded Commonwealth-State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA).





Exceptional Disaster Assistance Recovery Grants

Directly Affected Primary production Businesses

The maximum grant amount is \$75,000:

- An **initial amount of up to \$5,000** is available to support an initial claim. Evidence of the direct damage such as photographs, quotations, tax invoices and official receipts is required.
- A **subsequent amount of up to \$70,000** is available to support subsequent claims for which full evidence of payment is required.



Closure date of the grant is 2 April 2026.





Exceptional Disaster Assistance Recovery Grants

Eligible activities

- √ Hiring equipment and materials to undertake clean-up
- ✓ Additional labour costs (above and beyond normal wage expenditure i.e. day-to-day staffing)
- ✓ Disposing of damaged goods and injured or dead livestock, including associated costs
- √ Repairs to buildings (other than housing)
- √ Fencing that is not covered by any other assistance
- ✓ Reconditioning/ repairing essential plant and equipment
- √ Salvaging crops, grain and feeds
- ✓ Hire/ lease costs for equipment essential to the immediate resumption of the business.
- √ Payment for tradespeople to conduct safety inspections
- ✓ Essential repairs to premises and internal fittings that is not covered by insurance.





Disaster Assistance Loans

Primary producers & small business that were directly affected

Disaster Assistance Loans of up to \$250,000 are provided to assist primary producers and small businesses to re-establish the normal operations of their business by covering costs such as:

- repairing or replacing damaged plant and equipment
- repairing or replacing farm buildings
- purchasing livestock to replace those lost in the disaster event
- meeting carry-on requirements including:
- re-planting, restoring or re-establishing areas affected by the disaster event
- sustenance
- essential property operations
- paying rent and rates

Directly affected Non-profit organisations

Disaster Assistance Loans of up to \$100,000 are provided to assist non-profit orgnisations to re-establish the normal operations of your organisation by covering costs such as:

- repairing or replacing damaged plant and equipment
- repairing or replacing essential premises including grounds, amenities and infrastructure
- supplying stock for up to one month to replace lost stock and maintain liquidity of the organisation





Disaster Assistance (Essential Working Capital) Loans

Indirectly affected Primary producers, small business & non-profit organisations

Disaster Assistance (essential Working Capital) Loans are provided to assist primary producers with essential working capital for expenses such as:


- paying salaries or wages
- paying creditors
- paying rent or rates
- buying goods, including for example, fuel essential to carry-on the business or organisation
- buying fodder or water for livestock or produce
- transporting livestock or produce.

Applications for these loans will be accepted until 31 December 2026. Interest rate for all Disaster Lending for this event is 2.14%
